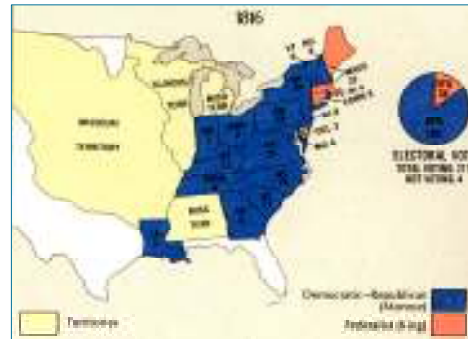

**Rush-Bagot Agreement October 2,  
1818.**

- The naval force to be maintained upon the American Lakes by His Majesty and the Government of the United States shall henceforth be confined to the following vessels on each side, that is —
- On Lake Ontario, to one vessel not exceeding one hundred tons burden, and armed with one eighteen pound cannon.
- On the upper lakes, to two vessels, not exceeding like burden each, and armed with like force.
- On the waters of Lake Champlain, to one vessel not exceeding like burden, and armed with like force.

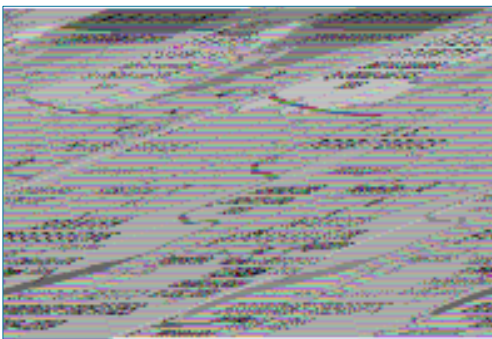

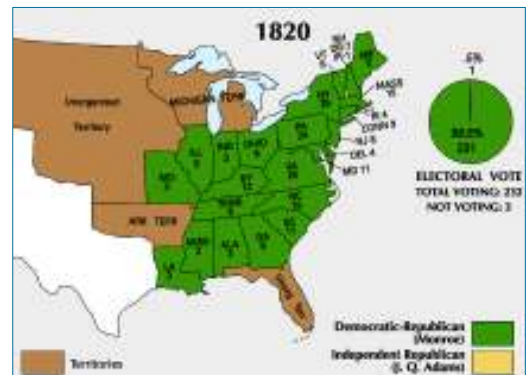
## Jackson Again

- War Hero sent to Florida border
  - Stop runaway slaves
  - Convince Spain to stop accepting same
  - Deal with Seminole Indians using Florida as a hide-out.
- Against orders he
  - Attacks two Spanish forts
  - Hangs two Spaniards
  - Hangs two Indians
- J.Q. Adams calls him back
  - Monroe wants to fire him
  - J.Q. Adams uses Spain's fear of Jackson to get the Adams-Onís Treaty

## The Tallmadge Amendment

- p All slaves born in Missouri after the territory became a state would be freed at the age of 25.
- p Passed by the House, not in the Senate.
- p The North controlled the House, and the South had enough power to block it in the Senate.

Candidate	Popular Vote	Electoral Vote
Andrew Jackson	43%	99
J. Q. Adams	31%	32
William Crawford	13%	41
Henry Clay	13%	37
